Topeka High to recognize the 100 year anniversary of the end of World War I

November 11, 1918 marked the end of fighting in World War I and the beginning of the Armistice. From this date we now have Veteran's Day. Topeka High will recognize the day in history on Friday, November 9th with a 7 am sunrise flag raising ceremony on THS Constitution Plaza in honor of our graduates who gave their lives in WWI.

Following is an article, written in 1932, about the THS Memorial Boulder that is placed at the entrance of Hoehner Auditorium.

World War I Memorial Boulder From Sixty-Two Years of History in the Topeka High School Copyright, 1932

The boulder which bears the names of Topeka High School's World War I dead represents the entire school's tribute. Several groups were instrumental in securing the memorial.

Fifteen World War I soldiers in 1919 had returned to school. One of them, George Baker, was approached by a *World* reporter for a story. Deeply stirred, George replied "Those of us who came home safely do not need a story, but something ought to be done for the fellows who did not come back."

That was the beginning. The matter was taken up with R.R. Cook, principal, and with C. H. Hepworth, vice-principal. Both heartily approved and Mr. Cook suggested that all arrangements be turned over to the Pia Societas, whose work was the furthering of patriotic duties. A committee was appointed, with Dr. W. H. Grieder as chairman. George Baker, with Sumner Cole, another over-seas ex-service student, was appointed to take charge of securing and placing the boulder.

Boys in the athletic department wished to pay for the memorial but the committee felt that the entire school should be privileged to contribute. A collection was taken up, and the response was almost 100 per cent. The bronze plate which was ordered was affixed to a red granite boulder secured from a farm south of town, and on May 30, 1920, it was dedicated. The Rev. John McAfee, World War I chaplain, was in charge of the out-door service.

Every year since that time, a brief ceremony has been held at the boulder in observance of Armistice Day. The Pia Societas decorates the stone with a wreath, the school gives the pledge to the flag and taps are sounded.

Kenneth Sutherland, THS January 1917, was the first Topeka High School boy to fall. He was killed in action July 17, 1918, and was buried with full military honors in a French military cemetery in Alsace.

The other boys whose memory Topeka High School honored for their sacrifice on the memorial boulder are:

Robert Melton, THS June 1915 – Died in training camp, 1918.

Lyman Rice, THS 1913 - Died in a hospital in Limoges, France, 1918.

Crosby Deacon, THS June 1913 – Died early in 1919 in France, but not in action.

Victor Blakely, THS 1912 – killed in his first day of battle, October 14, 1918.

Harold Olson, THS June 1917 – Killed in Battle of Argonne, October 14, 1918.

William Bolinger, freshman at the time of enlistment – Died March 2, 1919, while in reconstruction work at Lille. France.

Miss Fay Friedburg, THS June 1914, was not included on the memorial boulder. She died while in government work in Washington, DC and, at the time, was the only woman graduate of Topeka High School to die in government service.

Black and Gold Report Graduates & Staff in the Spotlight

Dr. Lloyd Lee Dodson (THS 1942) 4/20/1924-12/21/2013



Striking out Joe DiMaggio on just three pitches at an exhibition game June 18, 1948, in Kansas City may have been Lee Dodson's favorite memory. He grew up playing baseball, he coached baseball, promoted baseball and was one of baseball's greatest fans. While Lee Dodson may be remembered by myriad Topekans and Washburn University students, faculty and staff as a baseball aficionado; he was also a dedicated educator, administrator, friend and family

man.

A life-long Topekan, Lee attended Lowman Hill and Randolph grade schools, and Boswell Junior High, graduating from Topeka High School in 1942. After high school Lee enlisted in the US Army in November 1942, serving in the 1574th as a member of the US Army Corps of Engineers and then serving in both the European and Pacific Theaters of Operation until March 1946. After completing military duty, he combined playing baseball and attending Washburn University, graduating with a bachelor's in history education I 1951. He eventually earned a master's degree and doctorate degree, both in the field of education, from the University of Kansas.

As a young boy Lee played for various teams in Topeka, and then played as a right-handed pitcher with the Chanute Owls of the Kansas, Oklahoma and Missouri (KOM) League and later for the Topeka Owls, the New York Yankees, Kanas City Blues and the Newark Bears and other minor league baseball teams through 1951 when he entered the field of education. Not able to stay away from baseball, he created and managed several baseball leagues throughout Topeka.

Professionally, Lee was a teacher, principal and superintendent in Shawnee County and was an advocate for special education programs, women's sports, and students from all walks of life. He was Washburn University's Dean of Students from 1966 through retirement in 1989 with the title associate professor emeritus. In retirement, he continued teaching at Allen County Community College through 2009.

He is remembered for his genuine love, friendship and devotion to his family, friends and colleagues. His wife Kathleen died in 1993; they were parents to five children: Mary Lee, Kathleen, James, Richard and Steven.

Marsha Martin Sheahan (THS 1967)

- A record held by Michael H. Jackson (THS 1967) is 51 years old! Dr. Jackson set records in both swimming and track and his 176 feet 3 inch discus record remains unbroken. No one has come close since Denny Gragg threw 175 feet 11 inches in 1972.
- Larry Lonard (retired THS Staff, THS Distinguished Staff) was recognized in May 2018 by the Pushkin Institute in Russia for his contribution to the advancement and support for Russian language instruction in the U.S. The Pushkin Institute was founded to honor the famous Russian poet, Alexander Pushkin. The institute promote the study of Russian literature, linguistic research and teaching methodology. Mr. Lonard taught Russian at Topeka High School from 1974 until his retirement in 2005.
- Alexandra E. Blasi (THS 2002) was honored by the Washburn University Alumni Assoc. and Foundation on April 7, 2018, with the Gold Award. She has worked for the State of Kansas since 2011 after receiving her juris doctor, her fourth degree from Washburn. Currently she is the executive secretary of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy. She serves on Washburn's Alumni Association's Young Alumni Council and sings with the Topeka Festival Singers.
- Former Capital-Journal (TC-J) publisher, Mark Nusbaum (THS 1973), president of the Florida Times-Union since 2012 will retire near the end of this year. He started as a copy clerk at the TC-J on 1972, his senior year at THS. Nusbaum served as Group Publisher/Florida Division for Morris Communication: Group Publisher, NE Florida, for GateHouse Media; vice president of operations for Morris Publishing Group in Augusta, GA; publisher in Lubbock, TX from 1999 2004; publisher Topeka Capital-Journal from 2004-2011; and editor of the TC-J in the late 1990s.
- Topeka Public Schools Superintendent, Dr. Tiffany Anderson, has been named the 2018 Woman of Influence by the Greater Topeka Partnership
- Josh Mabry (THS 2005) headlined the Facebook Community Boost event in Topeka recently, which drew more than 400 people to learn about using social media effectively. He spent several years working at WIBW before joining the mega social media corporation three years ago. Facebook has pledged to train 1 million people across the country by 2020.
