Homecoming Weekend in September kicked off the 150th year of THS. In spite of Covid-19 we celebrated in style with past and present students and staff. Volunteers from every decade from the 1950s to the present helped make the weekend a success. Current students were showcased throughout the weekend. A Piece of THS History on display at Skinny's Bar and Grill

A piece of Topeka High School history hangs along the east wall of Skinny's Bar and Grill in Topeka at 4016 SW Huntoon. Often unnoticed amidst myriad lighted signs and posters decorating the walls of the popular hangout in central Topeka, Topeka High alumni often get up close to check out Coach Willie Nicklin's signature on the lower left quadrant of the floor.

"It arrived in twelve pieces when the gym floor was refurbished about a decade ago," Mark "Skinny" Schonlaw (THS 1987), says. Schonlaw owns Skinny's Bar and Grill and welcomes alumni from all the area high schools. "I'm often teased by alumni from other schools, but they all respect the Coach Nicklin legend," he says.

"A friend was on the demolition team working to replace the floor," Mark says, "and he casually asked if I'd be interested in displaying a piece of the historic floor. With friends' help, we assembled it, framed it and gave it a place of honor along the east wall." Coach Nicklin came by and signed it, the only signature on the unique floor display.

Garry Cushinberry (THS 1975) and Woodrow "Woody" Carter (THS 1974), have lots of memories playing on the floor. Cushinberry was on the 1973 State Championship team and recalls Coach Nicklin wanting his team members to run 7–8-minute miles. "That was the way he weeded out those that weren't going to make the team," Cushinberry says.

Carter, who only played as a senior in 1974, recalls running the stairs in The Dungeon as the THS gym is known. Woody says, "you had to remember to get your foot up high, those aren't just regular steps!" Experiencing lots of wins, and a few loses under Coach Nicklin, they remember him fondly and have many stories to tell including taking driver's education classes with Coach Nicklin as the driving coach and going by bus to games outside Topeka.

There are laughs and more stories as the two, along with current **THS Basketball Coach Ty Baumgard-ner**, reminisce about Coach Nicklin who passed away December 10, 2020. Coach Baumgardner says, looking at the center court piece of the floor, "it's all about signature. tradition."

Nicklin was the head coach at THS from 1970 to 1994 and guided the Trojans to two State Championships

(1973 and 1986), three State Championship 2nd place finishes, fourteen League Championships (Sunflower and I-70), eleven Sub-State Championships and seven Topeka Invitational Tournament Crowns. In 2006, the basketball court at Topeka High was named 'Willie Nicklin Court' in his honor. He posted 501 overall wins during his coaching career.

THS Graduate Hall of Fame 2021

A security officer, band director, and broadcast engineer were inducted into the Topeka High School Graduate Hall of Fame at 2 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 17, in the THS Hoehner Auditorium. The expansive space allowed for distancing and was a lovely substitute to the Woodward Library space.

One former staff member was honored as Distinguished Staff.

This was part of the 150th of Topeka High School Celebration and the 40th Hall of Fame ceremony, with 122 THS graduates having been inducted and 25 former staff/faculty honored with the Distinguished Staff designation.

A reception, in the main hallway, followed the ceremony. The THS Madrigals, THS String Ensemble and THS Marine Corps Junior ROTC participated in the ceremony.

The three honorees whose portraits have been added to the Hall of Fame Room are:



Marian Knight Douglas (THS 1950). Security Officer. Active in sports at Topeka High, Marian Knight was a cheerleader for the school's black basketball squad, the Ramblers, before integration of teams in 1949. She worked for ten years at the Kansas Neurological In-

stitute prior to being hired by USD 501. Upon acquiring a certificate from the Topeka Police Academy, Mrs. Douglas became a security officer at Topeka High (1979 – 2017).



Steve Holloman (THS 1970). Educator/Music Director. After high school graduation, Steve Holloman majored in music education at Washburn. From there (1975) he taught general music and choir at Boswell Jr. High School. When that school closed in 1980, he be

came music teacher at Robinson Middle School and assistant band director at

THS. After a year, Holloman was appointed band director at Topeka High, a post he held until 2016. Among numerous achievements, he took the Trojan Marching Band to the Cotton bowl Parade in 1986 and 1989. From 1992 to 2014, the performed 11 times at Disney World.



Gary L. Krohe (THS 1971).

Broadcast Engineer. Gary Krohe received his B.A in Communication Arts at Washburn and then majored in electrical engineering at K-State. He has held many positions in broadcast engineering, having designed and built many television stations. Presently (since 2014) he

is Director of Engineering and Technology for KTWU-TV at Washburn University, However, Mr. Krohe is best known to Trojans as author, designer, and publisher of the coffee table book *Portraits of Troy: The Architecture of Topeka High School*.



Anton Ahrens (Staff). Chemistry Instructor. A Topeka West graduate, Anton Ahrens' college education background includes a bachelor's degree in Chemical Science from K—State. Research Fellow at the

Air Force Geophysics Lab, and Master of Science, Chemistry from KU. Teaching stints were at Highland Park HS (chemistry, physics, general science, and astronomy) and Topeka High (chemistry) from 1984 to 2016. In 2008 Mr. Ahrens was named Kansas Teacher of the Year (team), promoting public education across the state.

THS Grad Makes a Difference for Students

Joe Pennington (THS 1987) is one of those Topeka High volunteers that just "shows up" at the right place and the right time. An entrepreneur and business owner in his own right, having started as Stevenson Company, a Topeka-based metal fabricator, in 1991, Joe has been a guest speaker in Murray Moore's entrepreneur class. Moore says, "Joe lets students see the real steps involved in starting a business, helping them visualize

their own business ideas." Joe has also been a mentor to students and always takes the time to visit about ideas whether at a football game or just walking the halls. Joe was quick to volunteer to serve as a shark tank judge for students' business plans; even asking the students to make their pitch in the space where they dreamed of opening a coffeeshop. When the students

needed counter tops, Joe said, "I do stainless steel." Moore said, "I had my student negotiate and seal the deal for the countertops."

Joe participated in debate and National Honor Society while at Topeka High School and is now president of Stevenson Company, a trusted vendor inside food plants across the country, creating sanitary design and fabrication services for the world's best producers of candy, nuts, and snacks. Their hallmark product is the innovative Spiral Chute installed wherever fragile food product is handled. Professionally Joe serves on the Apprenticeship Training Committee in Kansas City. He is a graduate of Leadership Greater Topeka and was co-founder of Forge, Topeka's Young Professional Organization. Joe is married to Erin Bess Brunton Pennington (THS 1988); they have two children who have attended THS.



USS Constitution gets first woman commander

Cmdr. Billie J. Farrell will become the first woman to lead the crew of the 224-year-old warship on January 21. Farrell is a native of Paducah, Kentucky, a 2004 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, and most recently served as the executive officer aboard U.S.S. Vicksburg. THS and Old Ironsides have a significant connection. Three spars from the warship have been THS flagpoles since 1931. Congratulation Cmdr. Farrell!





THS HISTORICAL SOCIETY ACCOUNTS
