Ice Cream Social Honoring the THS Class of 2021 – May 22, 2021. Sarah McGrew Ansnick, Susie Nuss Reichenberger, Sandy Singer, Mary Patzkowsky Reilly, Sharon Cheschier Zimmerman, Kris Grooms Trimmer, Jan Miller Karlin, and Joan Barker, all from the 100th THS Class of 1971, provided the ice cream for the 150th THS Class of 2021 before their graduation.

Annual Patriotic Chimes Concert – June 27, 2021. Held the Sunday before July 4th on the THS Front Lawn. Jerry Anderson, 1967 has been playing the THS Chimes for many years.

Topeka High School's Birthday – September 17, 2021. Denise Heavner (THS Faculty), with assistance from other THS staff oversaw the ordering of 2,000 cupcakes and organized the set up for the event. Birthday cupcakes were served to the current students and staff on the front lawn honoring the first day of Topeka High in 1871. Reminiscing: High School could be quite an exercise

An article from the Capital-Journal, by Alice Van Petten Lyon 1925

Many years ago, readers of the Topeka Capital-Journal were invited to submit their recollections for a monthly section "Reminiscing", to the attention of Phil Anderson THS 1976.

Mrs. Lyon's perspective provides a contrast between attending Topeka High in the "old" building before the present building on 10th Avenue.

These are Mrs. Lyon's memories of THS.

I went to Topeka High School in the 1920s, when it was located at 8th and Harrison Streets, one part in the "old" building on the north side of the street and the other part in the "new" building on the south corner.

Since my homeroom happened to be on the fourth floor of the old building, it was quite a climb each morning up the winding circular stairway. I often think now of the real fire menace that stairway created.

Classes held in the south building meant going across the street in all kinds of weather with no time to go to a locker for raincoat or jacket. The main office and the principal's office were in the north building and the assistant principal and his staff were in the south building to assure constant supervision.

I really don't remember the lunch room, but I am sure there was one. What I do remember is skip-

ping out of lunch period and racing up to 8th and Kansas Avenue to buy a sandwich and a chocolate soda at Rexall's Drug Store and then running back to make our after noon classes on time: I also recall skipping a last class in order to get to the Orpheum theater, then on 8th between Jackson and Kansas. Avenue, where we went to see Rudolph Valentino in "Blood and Sand."

Football games were on the west end of the Washburn campus where there were wooden bleachers. Moore Bowl was in the process of being built in the early 20s. Basketball was in the boys gym; the girls gym was much smaller. I remember little about it. What I do recall are very full and ample bloomers - not shorts - and white blouses with black ties. We did have a wonderful teacher, Grace Elmore, who made this required class fun.

I graduated in 1925, and the graduation ceremonies were held in the old City Auditorium.

Despite winning the first state title in program history in 2021, the Topeka High softball team felt it still had something to prove to the softball community. A second straight state title, with a another win over rival Washburn Rural, was a good way to make sure people recognized the program. Nija Canady, who will be playing softball for Stanford next year, said, "I'll always remember the state title...the bus rides; the crying, the laughing, the TikTok dances we made...that's what I'm gonna remember....and the two banners hanging in our gym."



In April, THS Assistant Principal, Rob Hays, competed in the 126th annual Boston Marathon after receiving a special send-off of Running the Halls from administrators, students, and staff. Mr. Hays averaged 06:20 per mile, placing third and receiving the bronze medal in his division. With a placement of 901 out of nearly 25,000 competitors, Mr. Hays was in the top 4% of runners at the marathon.
