THS Graduate Hall of Fame

A museum director, McDonald's franchise founder, and Los Alamos laboratory fellow were inducted into the Topeka High School Graduate Hall of Fame on October 2, 2022 in the THS Hoehner Auditorium. Two former staff members will also be honored as Distinguished Staff.

This was the 41st Topeka High Hall of Fame ceremony, with 125 THS graduates having been inducted and 26 former staff & faculty honored with the Distinguished Staff designation.

The three honorees whose portraits will be added to the Hall of Fame Room and two former faculty members are:



Dina M. Bennett Director of Collections & Curatorial Affairs, American Jazz Museum

After graduating from Topeka High in 1985, Dr. Dina Bennett received her B.A. in Communication Studies from Washburn University, completed her master's in College Student

Personnel from Kansas State University and a Ph. D. in Ethnomusicology with a minor in African American & African Diaspora Studies from Indiana University. Bennett has over 30 years of experience in the music field. In 2021, Dr. Bennett became the Director of Collections & Curatorial Affairs of the American Jazz Museum in Kansas City. She is also an accomplished pianist.



James Wylie Gordon Retired, Laboratory Fellow, Los Alamos National Laboratory

A member of the Topeka High class of 1952, James Gordon attended the University of Chicago before his enlistment in the Navy from 1954-1957. Following his time

serving his country, Mr. Gordon earned his B.S. and a Ph. D. in Physics at the University of Kansas. For 20 years, he worked at Los Alamos National Laboratory in New Mexico, serving as a staff member, group leader, and laboratory fellow. Over his career, Mr. Gordon received several accolades, including the prestigious E.O. Lawrence Memorial Award presented by the Department of Energy. In his retirement, Mr. Gordon and his family moved back to Kansas, settling in Baldwin City. Mr. Gordon passed away in March of 2016.



Ralph King

Retired, Founder & Owner, Kings Management Company

Graduate of Topeka High in 1959, Ralph King was the founder and owner of King's Management Company. An award-winning

organization that operated ten McDonald's restaurant locations in the Kanas City Metro for over 30 years. His work with McDonald's went beyond owning franchises, Mr. King was a brand ambassador, as well as served as Co-op President. Mr. King is also a passionate and active board member with the Ronald McDonald House Charities, including serving as the Director of Ronald McDonald Children's Charity. Before he embarked on his entrepreneurial career, Mr. King completed his degree in Political Science at Washburn University, while also working at Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company. Since his retirement in 2019, Mr. King continues to be involved within his community and serves as a board member of his church.



Harley Becker

Retired, Economic & Government Faculty, Topeka High Distinguished Staff

Harley Becker's military career brought him to Kansas in the late 1950s. While stationed at Fort Riley, Mr. Becker graduated from Kansas State

University with both his bachelor's and master's degrees in economics. Soon after Mr. Becker and his family moved to Topeka when he was hired to teach by Topeka Public Schools, USD 501. For over 30 years, Mr. Becker taught economics and government classes at Topeka High School. He was also instrumental in the establishment of Topeka High's photography program, a favorite hobby of his. Mr. Becker retired from Topeka High and teaching in 1996.



Patrick Ryan

Retired, History & Social Studies Faculty, Topeka High Distinguished

As the only child of two traveling teachers, Patrick Ryan received a diverse education early on. Their work took him from the prairie of Kansas to the desert of Nevada and back. After high

school, Mr. Ryan attended Rockhurst College, before enlisting in the Army. Once his service of duty was complete, Mr. Ryan worked toward his teaching career. Attending Washburn University and receiving his master's degree at the University of Kansas. In 1969, Mr. Ryan began his tenure at Topeka High. Teaching a multitude of history classes, including US and Kansas History, as well as Government. Since retiring in 1999, Mr. Ryan occupies his time traveling with his family and volunteering.

THE STORY BEHIND A 1971 YEARBOOK PHOTOGRAPH

The last photograph in the 1971 Sunflower is a full page of the tower with folks sitting on the THS granite sign, while watching the class of 1971 graduation. The photo in this article was shot by Leighton Mark Highland Park HS Class of 1969. This is Gary Krohe's story behind the iconic picture.

David Haynes 1971, Randy Saylor 1971, and I were graduating during the ceremony. To get yearbook photos we had to get another photographer to shoot the graduation. It was special ceremony since the class of 1971 was the 100th THS graduating class and it was being held on the lawn at THS. So, having been recently hired by Washburn student publications I talked my two new friends, who were the other WU publication photographers, into covering it for us. I'd process the photos the night of the graduation for the yearbook deadline a day or so later.

David Haynes and I decided to kill two birds with one stone. We had a graduation party at my parents house, in the basement, connected to my home darkroom. Leighton Mark and Doug Cummins delivered the film to David and me right at my house after graduation and of course stayed for the party. David and I processed the film, made prints, and hosted the 50 or so guests with the entire basement lit with red lights for printing.

Red lights, music, no parents, and beer...what could go wrong? There are many stories from this party that I will pass on telling for now.

One of the party guests was Sue Elliot, the 1971 Sunflower editor. I introduced her to Leighton Mark. A couple of years later I was best man at their wedding. Sadly, the marriage didn't last. Leighton graduated from WU, went on to work for the daily newspaper in Independence MO. UPI/AP noticed him and soon he was assigned to cover the embassy bombing in Beirut in 1984. Leighton was critically wounded and almost died. He lost the use of his right arm and hand. After two years of recovery AP/

UPI put him back to work at the White House.

National Geographic designed and built him a special camera that he could use one handed with his left hand only. Leighton went on to be the Chairman of the White House press Photographers Association for many years, shooting many front page photos of presidents from Reagan to Obama. He retired in 2016 and after a short stay in California retired in Topeka at Lexington Park. He passed away on 1/22/2019.

Maintaining the Topeka High original furniture David Clark 1967

Five years ago I attended my 50th class reunion. It was great to see friends that I have not seen for many years and we all had a good time. During our dinner Joan Barker gave us a list of items the class could donate to the school. I learned that The Topeka High Historical Society was refinishing furniture to help preserve and maintain that special Topeka High beauty and charm. I reached out to Joan thinking I might be able to help in this endeavor. I started working on library chairs and cafeteria chairs. Since then, library tables, some office furniture, display units, drafting tables, art gallery benches, some hallway doors on the first floor have been shown attention. In total I have worked on over 130 items in the last 5 years.

Recently I started refinishing the main office counter that contains 104 teacher mailboxes. It has been joy to work with the THS staff and learn more about the current school environment.

Not many know there is a furniture graveyard in the lower level of the school. Broken chairs are stored there until someone is able to repair and refinish them. Not all chairs could be repaired but I have combined good pieces of various broken chairs to make a useable chair.

One of my bigger projects was refinishing the paneled walls in the Cavalier Room. When you have a tour of the school you must stop by that room. All the furniture has been restored, along with new lighting and fresh paint. It has become a mini Art Gallery with work by THS graduates Martha Herrick, Walter Hatke, Margaret Whittemore, and Thomas McCoy.

I want to thank all those that have contributed to THSHS in funding the many school projects including refinishing of the furniture. Most of the furniture goes back to the 1930's when the current building was built. It is my hope that much of the furniture will still be in use in another 90 years.

The processes I go through in refinishing includes: A. Tighten all screws and bolts.

- B. Strip the object of the old finish. (Yes, I remove all gum that has been left.)
- C. Light sanding. I leave any carvings unless they are not appropriate. I feel this is part of the history of the item, even though we prefer no carvings in general.
- D. Adding two coats of stain.
- E. I complete the project by adding three coats of polyurethane with light sanding between coats.

Besides the furniture refinishing, your contributions have helped fund many other projects. A major project started in October of this year is the refurbishing of the main foyer walls. We will unveil and provide more specific information about this project soon.

THS project plans in 2023 call for the restoration of the masonry of the front veranda wall, the west side gym entrance walls, and the four fireplaces in the building. This work will include cleaning the surfaces and repairing the grouting.

All the projects that the THSHS sponsors for Topeka High are due to the generosity of donors like you. Donations have come from former students and others that love our building and want to see it preserved. Should you want to help, your donations would be appreciated. Black & Gold Report - Graduates in the Spotlight

- **Jeff Jacobsen 1969** was among the 1st group to be inducted in the Kansas Press Association's Kansas Photojournalism Hall of Fame. The special event was held in Topeka on November 19.
- Julie Jacobsen Phillips 2001 and Kelly Rippel 2005 were selected by the Jayhawk Area Council, Boy Scouts in this year's class of Topeka's "20 Under 40". Selection is based on commitment and contributions both professionally and personally. Julie is currently the Director of Grants, Communities in Schools of Mid-American, Inc. Kelly is the Crop Claims Adjustor, Zurich North America, Rural Community Insurance Services.
- 1985 THS Hall of Fame honoree **Joe Anderson 1961** was profiled in the September 2021 issue of Car and Driver. He spoke about his experience in the military, in the auto industry, and as a black man in America. Anderson graduated from Topeka High in 1961 and from West Point in 1965, commanded troops in Vietnam, and rose to head of General Motors body hardware business unit, with 7,000 employees and \$1 billion in revenue, before starting his own holding company.
