2024 INAUGURAL THS SPORTS HALL OF HONOR

Topeka High's administration, staff, employees, and student body have always appreciated the talented athletes who have helped define the determination, school spirit, and pride evident in our Trojan community. We owe a thank you to our athletes for modeling an enthusiastic participation in extracurricular activities, consistency, sacrifice, team spirit, good sportsmanship, and the results of making healthy choices.

Our athletic standouts deserve to be honored for their significant impact on our school's reputation, including providing brave sports moments for local media coverage; celebrating and proving the importance of diversity in our world; and their continued influence on community athletics, post high school.

To the Stars Through Art: A History of Art Collecting in Kansas Public Schools, 1900-1950 August 22, 2023 - May 11, 2024

THS Historical Society is not a travel agency, but they strongly suggest taking a road trip to Manhattan, Kansas before May 2024. A destination worth your time is the Marianna Kistler Beach Museum of Art on the Kansas State University Campus. Topeka High was selected to be part of the exhibition *To the Stars Through Art: A History of Art Collecting in Kansas Schools, 1900-1950* by loaning several pieces of art.

The following explanation of the exhibition was taken from the Marianna Kistler Beach Museum of Art Fall 2023 Newsletter.

"A team of regional scholars led by Curator Elizabeth Seaton have spent the last five years researching the history of art collecting by Kansas K-12 schools. The topic has propelled them around the state in search of treasures in classrooms, district offices, and museums. Seaton and her collaborators (including Kara Heitz, THS 1993) will present their discoveries in this exhibition of 65 works acquired by more than a dozen school districts. The exhibition will be the first survey of art collecting by schools in Kansas and the first study of art acquired by the nation's schools to give attention to boarding schools for Indigenous students.

A prominent theme in the exhibition is the heavy community involvement in the campaign to bring original artwork into Kansas schools. In 1911, the school superintendent in McPherson organized an exhibition to acquire art for the high school. This became an annual event attracting more than half of McPherson's residents. Ticket sales allowed the district to establish a rich collection of work by regionally and nationally recognized artists, among them Birger Sandzén, Fern Coppedge, and James Abbott

McNeill Whistler. Before 1950, districts in dozens of Kansas towns and cities joining McPherson in acquiring original art through traveling exhibitions, bequests from the Carnegie Corporation, new Deal art programs, and other avenues.

A goal of the "To the Stars Through Art" exhibition is to show the vital role American art played - and might play again - in Kansas schools and their communities. The exhibitions title, inspired by the state motto, *To the stars through difficulty*," alludes to the challenge of keeping the arts at the forefront of education. Another aim of the exhibition is to guide Kansas schools in caring for their collections and using them in teaching."

Black & Gold Report - Graduates in the Spotlight


- **Ramona Toledo Shump 1952** (1934 2023) raised four successful sons and one daughter as a single parent. She accomplished this while working over 30 years for the State of Kansas helping thousands of individuals on public assistance find permanent employment through programs CEDA, the Work Incentive Program (WIN), and Kansas Job Service. Ramona became a community activist in Topeka as a tenant of the Topeka Housing Authority. This advocacy culminated in the filing of a class action lawsuit Shump v. Balka in 1978. The attorney who filed the suit forwarded Ramona's name to the Legal Services Corporation (LSC), the largest source of funding for civil legal assistance to the poor. In 1978, President Jimmy Carter nominated Ramona to the national Board of Directors for the LSC. During her term fellow board members included the first African-American Justice of the Louisiana Supreme Court, a former U.S. Secretary of Commerce, and Hillary Rodham Clinton. Thank you, Ramona Shump, for being a role model for those of us who think we lack time and initiative to advocate for those less fortunate.
- Congratulations to Dané Shobe 2004 for being recognized at the 2023 Topeka ArtsConnect Awards with the Glenda Taylor Visual Arts Award for his work as a visual artist and the creation of Sun Hero Magazine. Dané is also well known for his work as an actor, his knack for teaching, and his use of his

- voice and artistic abilities to support others. Congratulations Dané.
- In October Beryl Massey New 1970 was recognized as a Washburn University 2023 Alumni Fellow in the School of Applied Studies. Dr. New retired in April 2023 after 35 years in education as a teacher, counselor, principal, administrator, and most recently as Topeka Public School's Director of the Equity Council and Certified Personnel. Thank you, Dr. New for your commitment to education and believing that every young person deserves a high quality education.
- Marcia Heil Johnston 1966 was awarded the Washburn University School of Law Lifetime Achievement Award in October 2023. She was one of four women in her law school graduating class in 1974 and the first woman to represent the school in the National Moot Court Competition and was a member of the team that won the local and regional Jessup International Moor Court Competitions.
- Jim McEntire 1969 and his family were recognized as the Legacy Family at the Washburn University School of Law Alumni Awards in October 2023. Three generations of Washburn Law School graduates were recognized starting with Jim's father, Richard McEntire 1928 and including Jim's wife, Joanna Corpstein, and daughter Helen "Lizzy" McEntire.



THS Class of 1949 classmates and community leaders Dr. Walt Menninger and Jack Alexander reminisced at the Friends of THS Lunch on December 11 that was held in the THS Teachers' Cafeteria.
